You are invited to have fun and learn about the Dike 14 Nature Preserve. The 88-acre wildlife haven on the shores of Lake Erie in the heart of Cleveland is now home to native Ohio plants, trees and animals, including more than 280 species of birds. Find out what's happening at the Dike 14 Nature Preserve where soils dredged from the Cuyahoga River have become a unique and diverse natural habitat. Hour-long hikes begin on the half hour. Early fall migration has begun. Monarch butterflies may be starting their trip over the Dike 14 Nature Preserve on their way to Mexico.
